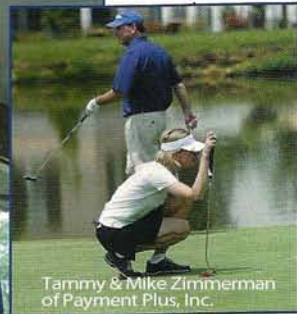


DID YOU KNOW...
